### **FM 91 ADDS THREE NEW PROGRAMS TO SCHEDULE**

Toledo, OH – Beginning in January, “Wait, Wait Don’t Tell Me” and “The Splendid Table” will join the FM 91 broadcast lineup, replacing “Whad’Ya Know.”

“Wait, Wait Don’t Tell Me,” NPR’s weekly hour-long quiz program, will air on Saturdays from 11:00 a.m. to noon. Each week on the radio, listeners can test their knowledge against some of the best and brightest in the news and entertainment world while figuring out what’s real news and what’s made up.

“The Splendid Table,” a culinary, culture, and lifestyle program that celebrates food and its ability to touch the lives and feed the souls of everyone, will air on Saturdays from noon to 1:00 p.m. Each week, Lynne Rossetto Kasper leads listeners on a journey of the senses and hosts discussions with a variety of writers and personalities who share their passion for the culinary delights.

Another addition to the FM 91 schedule is “Afropop Worldwide,” Public Radio International’s weekly music program showcasing music from Africa, the Caribbean and the Americas. Hosted by one of Africa’s best known and best loved broadcasters, Georges Collinet from Cameroon, the program is animated by Collinet’s warmth, love of the music, and insights about the cultures the music embodies. “Afropop Worldwide” will air on Sundays at 9:00 p.m., on FM 91, replacing WGTE’s long running, locally produced program “Electronic Currents,” which has ended due to the retirement of Richard Paton, the program’s host and producer.
